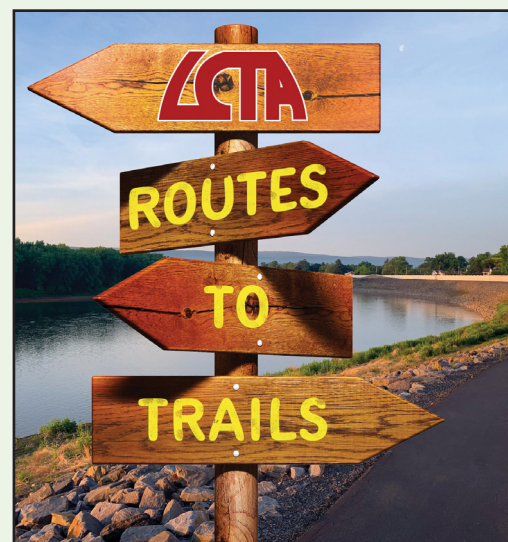


Welcome Aboard!

BUS SERVICE
 LCTA's hours for fixed route and ADA complementary services are 5:30 am to 11:00 pm, Monday through Friday, and 9:00 am to 5:30 pm on Saturday.

SENIORS RIDE FREE

Passengers 65 years of age or older ride free on the LCTA fixed route bus system with a Senior ID Card. To be eligible for the Free Fare Program, passengers must register with LCTA to obtain a Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Senior ID Card. To receive the Free Fare ID Card, passengers must bring approved proof of age document to LCTA's Wilkes-Barre office. An application will be completed and the ID card will be issued immediately.

BICYCLES

All LCTA buses are equipped with bike racks, located on the front of the bus. Racks are available on a first come, first served basis. Most regular, two-wheeled bikes fit into the racks. Microtransit vans do not have bike racks

CHILDREN

Children accompanied by an adult will ride free IF THEY ARE SHORTER THAN 42 INCHES regardless of their age. Children taller than 42 inches will pay full fare. Please attend to children while on the bus.

VIDEO SURVEILLANCE

All buses are equipped with video and audio surveillance. Your decision to board an LCTA vehicle is your consent to these recordings, and you acknowledge that your image and/or voice may be recorded by the on-board surveillance system. LCTA does not keep or maintain archive data on all recordings, only those that involve a significant reported incident.

Back Mountain Trail Luzerne, Dallas

Following an abandoned rail line this crushed stone trail passes through scenic woodlands, a field of wildflowers and a waterfall. Trail extends a total of 7 miles from Luzerne to Dallas.

This interconnected network of paved trails stretches approximately 12 miles. Built atop the flood protection levees, the trails offer scenic routes through several Luzerne County communities: Wilkes-Barre, Hanover Township, Plymouth, Edwardsville, Kingston, Forty Fort and Wyoming.

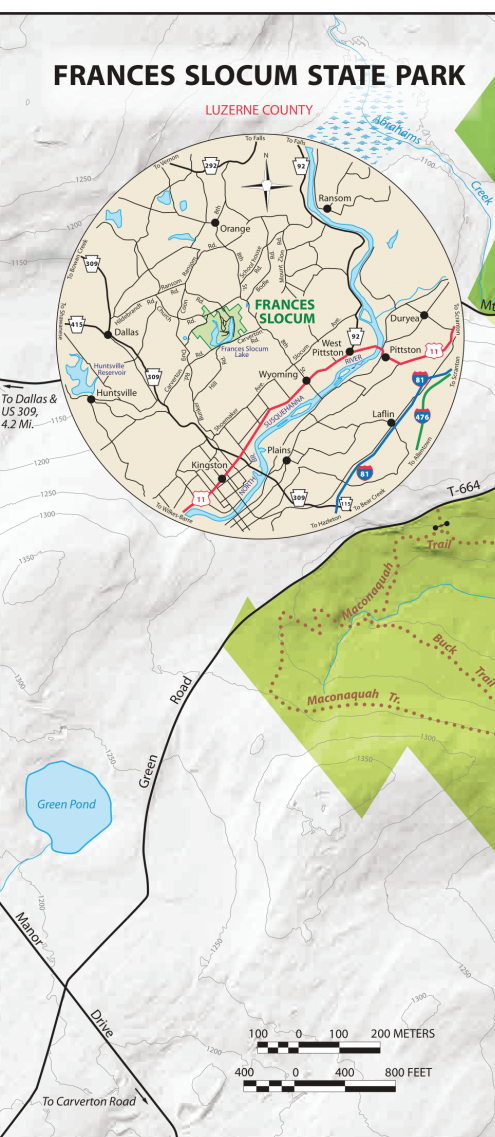

Kirby Park Kingston

52-acres of green space, ball fields, walking and biking paths, a pond and playground. Luzerne County Levee Trail borders the park. Park's original design was by firm founded by Frederick Law Olmstead who is widely regarded as the Father of American Landscape Architecture.

The 3.06-mile Ridgetop Trail which runs along the ridgeline of Wilkes-Barre Mountain and the Jacqueline Munro Trail, at 0.64-miles, provides a pedestrian route from Sugar Notch and the Greater Hanover Area Recreation Park athletic fields.

A well-maintained local park directly across from the levee trail. The park offers a half-mile paved walking loop, picnic areas, and restroom facilities. The park also features sports fields.
